It has been another exciting year with many new and different things happening to continue to engage and challenge our children and to seek out new ways to make our school the best it can be. Some highlights for our children and staff in 2019 at Tecoma have been:

Fiona has decided to step down from School Council after 6 years, 4 as President. Thank you Fiona for your service to the school, being a part of 2 school reviews in the process. Also stepping aside are Angie Hume and Danielle O'Brien after 6 and 7 years respectively. Thank you ladies for your service. Danielle has also played a significant role on the Parent Network over a number of years.

Thank you to the parents who continue to work hard in so many ways to make a huge contribution to our school's ongoing success. Thank-you to our Parent Network for another successful year. The Parent Network have been wonderful in raising \$20,000. I would like to acknowledge all members of the Parent Network for your hard work, especially those who rolled their sleeves up for the colour run that raised over \$12,000 for the school.

Thank you to our wonderful children. Having read your reports, we can see the progress you have made especially around your learning goals. Terrific progress has been made. Thank you kids for all your hard work.

Thankyou to all our Tecoma parents who ensure that everything that we ask and expect of them is done as well as possible. It takes a village to raise a child and the partnership we experience here is brilliant.

As the old saying goes *"use it or lose it"* and this is very applicable for students and their learning. It is very easy to see the holiday break as a time for relaxation and fun, and so it should be - they deserve a break. However students often return to school having lost some of the learning that they had previously mastered. So if you want your child to start the 2020 school year ready for learning, please set some time aside over the holidays to:

Read! Make sure that students are continuing to read, everyday if possible. Books are readily available from the local libraries, make great Christmas presents, and they can be read and reread many times. Newspapers and magazines are popular, even comics to entice the more reluctant. Older children can read to younger siblings. Set up some routines to make sure there is time for reading: each night before bed, in the morning, or while dinner is being prepared. Parents read with or to your child, children can read to you or retell the book or chapter they read. Discussing the content of the book is also crucial.

Count! We don't expect you to teach the mathematics curriculum, but making sure that your child has automatic recall (less than 2 seconds) of maths facts is crucial. Driving in the car is a good time to practise, encourage students to improve becoming faster and more accurate (with all students having different competence – ranging from counting forwards and backwards by 1s, and knowing numbers before and after in Prep to confidence with addition and subtraction facts, multiplication and division facts in the senior school).

One of the best presents you can give your child this Christmas is a love of learning which makes their future brighter.

IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN

The school year is almost over. The Christmas holidays are just around the corner.

"Where did the last twelve months go?" That's the adult viewpoint.

Kids think, "What took so long?" Different ages, different perspectives.

Kids generally want to plunge into holidays, leaving schoolwork, timetables and teachers behind. That's only natural.

But before they get too far into holiday mode, consider how you'll round out the year, and bring it to a close.

If your child is finishing primary school then our graduation ceremony signals the end of one phase of their school lives.

The greater importance given to school graduation ceremonies over the last few decades is recognition of the human need to bring closure to one stage of life, and prepare for the next.

Kids of all ages benefit from parental recognition of their achievements and successes as it sets the stage for the coming school year.

Here are a few ideas from Michael Grose (parent educator) to help you close off the old year to prepare for the year ahead:

1. Discuss the highlights and the lowlights of the year: Ask kids to name their highlights, favourite times or most memorable moments of the year just gone. Use age appropriate language and questions that will open them up, rather than shut them down. At the year's end you could ask your children to rate the year from 1 to 5, and to identify their best memory, their favourite subject and something new that they encountered.

2. Celebrate improvement and success: Identify one or two areas where they excelled, improved or overcame some challenges. Broaden the focus away from just academic performance and recognise achievement in social, sport or arts areas. It's important for kids who struggle academically to understand that you value success in a variety of areas.

3. Show appreciation: Consider how they can show appreciation to teachers, coaches or other people who may have assisted them during the year. Not only is it good manners to show gratitude, but some kids need reminding that other people contribute to their achievements.

4. Look forward: It may be beneficial to give your kids a chance to vent about some aspect of the year that they didn't like, found difficult or challenging. Try to limit this type of discussion so that it doesn't end in a whinge session and point them toward a better future next year.

5. Now relax: It's time for them to set the previous school year aside, put their feet up and chill out over the school break. Remember, if the previous year wasn't one of your child's best, the five to six week break gives him or her a chance to make a fresh start next year.

Please, it is very important that during the holiday break that the children's education continues. Give the children the opportunity to read recipes, to write postcards, to add up shopping lists, to work out how long or how many kilometres to the holiday destination. All fun ways to keep their education rolling. So much hard work goes into what your child has achieved both at home and at school so it's important these skills continue to be fostered over the 5 week break.

LAST DAY

As you would be aware, due to the 43 degrees heat tomorrow, our final assembly will be held **today from 2.45pm – 3.30pm** where we say farewell to our Grade 6 students and other staff and students who will not be returning to Tecoma PS in 2020. With the predicted top of 26 today, it will be much more comfortable.

Friday will be a normal school day, though we will finish at 2.30pm with the grade 6 children ringing the school bell to signify the end of their primary school journey.

A reminder there is no Out of School Hours Care on Friday afternoon.

GRADE 6 GRADUATION

Grade 6 children and their families enjoyed their very special graduation ceremony at Burrinja followed by dinner at Upwey/Belgrave RSL on Wednesday evening with many favourable comments on this night being passed on by participating parents.

Making the most of these holidays

You don't need an instruction manual to make the most of the school holidays. After all, holidays are about kicking your feet up, relaxing and getting away from the usual routines. Right? But the festive season can be stressful for many. For parents the prospect of keeping children occupied for up to six weeks can be daunting.

Christmas can also be a difficult and lonely time for some. Sole parents and step-parents usually experience particular challenges at this time of the year as family catch-ups cause conflict, and disputes can arise over who children spend their time with. Often family differences are contained during the year but spill over when normal routines cease over the holiday period.

Here are some ways to help reduce tension over the festive season and make the holiday season enjoyable and fruitful for all:

- 1. Be creative with how festivities are organised. If you are flexible with your arrangements as well as your thinking then the potentially tricky times will flow more easily. For instance, two or more Christmas dinners may be needed so everyone is included.*
- 2. Mix up the routines. The best part about holidays is the change from the routines of school-life. Some kids feel comfortable with the routines of school-life and can feel a little lost until the new holiday routine kicks in. Be patient with these routine junkies! Also make sure you begin adjusting the routine as returning to school comes closer so kids are prepared for going to bed and getting up at earlier times.*
- 3. Mix 'me' time with 'them' time. Plan a mixture of outdoor activities or trips with quiet at home activities where you can relax and recharge your own batteries. The holidays give you a chance to spend time as a family but you also need to take some time for yourself each day. It helps to let your kids know that you are having some time out too.*
- 4. Resist being your child's home entertainment machine. Give children opportunities to keep themselves occupied or think of inexpensive, fun ways to keep themselves amused. "I'm bored" is an invitation for kids to keep themselves occupied rather than for you to keep them amused.*
- 5. Team up with other families. Whether it is sharing celebrations with other families or just holidaying with friends, holidays offer the chance to broaden your child's social circle.*

*Make sure you provide the three types of activities that children want with their parents – i.e. **rituals and celebrations**, including family mealtimes; **one-on-one activities** where you spend some time alone with each child; and **unstructured, impromptu activities** such as playing simple games, storytelling and walks around the neighbourhood. These are important relationship-building activities that bind families together and enable you to build up emotional collateral with kids as they move into adolescence.*

This article comes courtesy of parenting educator, Michael Grose. Whilst parenting is not an exacting science it's sometimes helpful to reflect on the way we do things because small things can make a difference.

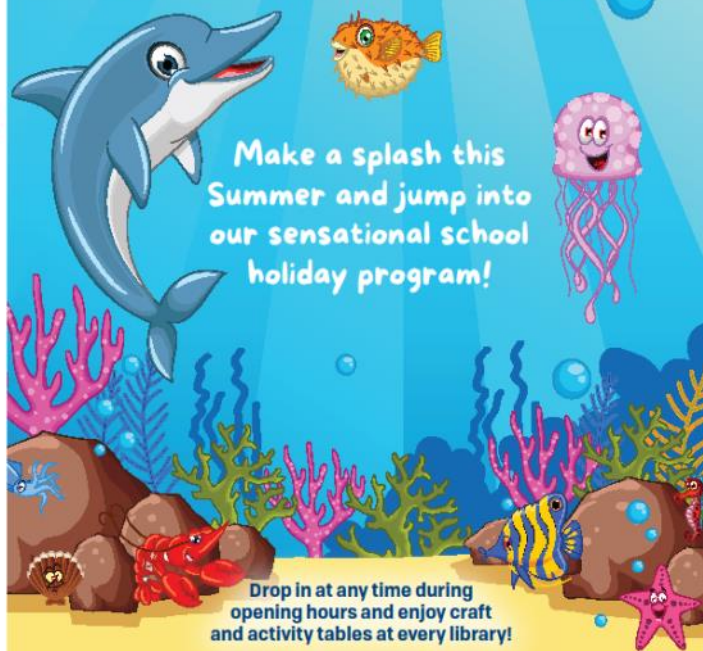
