#### BACK ON SITE

It was with much excitement on Monday morning that we welcomed back all the children to onsite learning. While it was an option to stagger the return of the children across the week, we feel that every day is crucial and we needed the children back.

A big thank you to everyone in our community (staff, students and parents) for all your efforts in working together for the best possible outcome for our children.

Overall, the return back has been smooth. The children were extremely excited to see each other and their teachers and the transition back has been successful. While some children excelled during remote learning, others struggled with not having interaction with their classmates in person on a daily basis. I know remote and flexible learning has not always been easy, but through our collective efforts, our students have continued to make valuable progress in their learning. A smooth return to school is crucial as we aim to settle the students back into a routine and back into the 'groove' and re-establish relationships.

As the term progresses, we will continue to have in place strong measures to protect the health and safety of students, staff, families and the community. This includes staggering start and finish times, restricting parent access to school grounds and continued emphasis on hand hygiene and physical distancing where possible. All our high touch areas are being cleaned continuously throughout the day and I once again respectfully remind parents they should not enter the school buildings.

We thank the school community for adhering to the guidelines we sent out last week regarding drops offs and pick ups, as well as movement in and around the school. It enables us to provide the safest possible environment during this time. We all have a role to play in stopping the spread of COVID-19 in our community.

#### STAY HOME WHEN UNWELL

The most important action to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, is to stay at home when unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms.

#### HAND HYGIENE & ADDITIONAL CLEANING

All staff and students will undertake regular hand hygiene and increased cleaning will occur throughout the school day.

All students must bring their own drink bottle. Students cannot drink from drinking fountains at this time.

These will be wiped down as part of the enhanced cleaning program.

Our priorities for term 4 are:

1. Mental health and wellbeing
2. Learning with a major focus on Literacy and Numeracy
3. Transitions in, through and out of school

Of course, our core focus at Tecoma is student learning with a focus on literacy and numeracy. Our curriculum is carefully planned to ensure that all students maximise their learning in these important areas. Teachers will be continuing to undertake a range of assessment activities coming out of the post COVID period, in preparation for the modified end of year reports – it is very important that children attend school every day.

We note with interest the call out by our state government this week for former teachers or people with Victorian Institute of Teaching accreditation to register to be a tutor in 2021. While there is still much detail to come on this initiative, we have already put in place plans to support the academic progress of the children as they return this term but also in 2021.

Mrs Shelley Smith, one of our much loved teachers, currently on maternity leave has been employed this term to support literacy and numeracy coming out of COVID. Her role will be to coordinate the teaching of the basics, the foundation blocks in both literacy and numeracy that are so important in those younger years. At this stage, we will enhance this role further next year and anything from the state government regarding tutors will be a bonus.

While grade 5 camp is still booked, at this stage, it is not permitted to go ahead. We won't be running excursions as we try and make the most of what we have left in 2020. A number of our traditional end of year activities will not go ahead as planned such as the Christmas Carols night. Prep transition onsite is uncertain at this stage but we are hoping to have small groups of children attend sessions, similar to what is occurring in regional schools at present. This will depend on announcements from our Premier in coming weeks. We will continue to send out our weekly recorded introductory videos to kinder families and one of our staff will be visiting kinder children to meet the children in person.

Discussion around Prep and grade 6 graduation has begun. It may be different to our previous ceremonies but we are committed to providing the students with a ceremony. At this stage, parents will not be able to attend any sort of assembly or ceremony as per the current directions from the Department of Education but we will continue to utilise video platforms that served us so well during remote learning to share in these experiences. I do hope this changes with these important celebrations, however, as we have experienced, things can change quickly but at the moment, you need to be aware of the worst case scenario.

### **STAFFING AND GRADE STRUCTURES FOR 2021**

I cannot believe we are at this time of year, but we are now looking at structures for 2021. I think I know where the year has gone!

Throughout November and early December, we will be working on our class structures and student combinations for next year. Changes in student numbers and staffing combinations usually cause us to reshape our proposed class structures several times throughout this term.

Due to COVID, our numbers in Prep are uncertain and we have several staff placements that may or may not be a part of our 2021 staff team, with various interview processes to occur.

At this stage, we hope to hold 19 classes next year for what is expected to be anything between 450 and 460 children, dependent on kinder families that are yet to enrol due to COVID. However, we need definite numbers across all levels before we make that decision.

As it stands now, the school is at capacity due to the number of buildings on site and only children living in our zone or with an older sibling will be able to enrol at our school as it stands today.

Due to this, it is vital that we are made aware of any circumstances that may impact on our enrolment numbers. Please let us know urgently if you intend to enrol a child at our school, if you are aware of people in our community who will be enrolling or if you intend to transfer to another school. We desperately require this information as soon as possible in order to establish grade structures for the start of the new school year. If you will not be at Tecoma in 2021, please notify the school office in writing as soon as possible.

### **What are the criteria that we use to make up class lists?**

Factors influencing class structure are:

- the educational needs of the students;
- the projected number of students in each year level;
- the ratio of girls to boys;
- the number of teachers employed at the school; and
- resources and facilities.

Factors which are considered in the placement of students include:

- academic performance – judgements over time
- work habits e.g. ability to work independently
- behaviour
- gender
- social network /friendships
- social maturity
- special needs e.g. twins, siblings.

### **What is the process for placing students into classes?**

Based on the criteria listed above, teaching staff and administration meet mid-term 4 to establish classes for the following school year.

Teachers ensure each new class has:

- a balance of academic ability
- gender balance
- socially balanced groups

During this process, changes and adjustments are made over several weeks. Each change may trigger a chain reaction of other changes.

Proposed class lists are submitted to myself and Assistant Principal Di Double for final ratification.

The new classes will be announced on the proposed Orientation Day, December 9. Traditionally, Prep classes have been announced on Prep information night in late November but that may need to take place in another format.

With this in mind, parents are now invited to write to me about any additional information that will help us in determining a placement for your child.

## **2021 GRADE PLACEMENT REQUESTS**

Parents are now invited to write to me about any concerns they may have for their child's educational needs for 2021.

Please note, requests for particular teachers **will not be** considered as the best interests of all of the children and the effective management of the school must be taken into account.

**Letters will be considered up until 4pm, Friday October 30, 2020.**

Letters received after this date will not be accepted unless in exceptional circumstances.

These letters are to be addressed directly to myself with all details and information provided kept in confidence.

While I have letters on file from previous years, I **will only be taking into account letters I receive this year**. Often friendship concerns become outdated as the children grow in maturity and have developed new friendships. However, if you have information from previous years that you feel I need to know that is relevant in regard to your child's placement, please include this in your letter. Please don't assume I know!

As you may understand, the allocating of children to classrooms is a very complex task and one that requires patience and a great deal of thought and manipulation. Please assist us to make this process as smooth as possible by taking note of the requests as outlined. Please also be aware that requests are indeed requests and does not mean it will automatically happen. We have decided, on balance, in previous years to not grant some requests. This is done with all the information that we have at our disposal and every decision will be made for the betterment of all children. Should you wish to discuss any concerns with 2021 grade placements, please contact the school office to arrange a time for a chat.

I am aware that 3/4M are well aware of this news, but we were very excited to hear during the remote learning period that our grade 3/4 teacher Lauren McNay and her partner Jake are expecting their first child in February.

Congratulations Lauren and Jake, we look forward to queueing up for the first post COVID hold of the baby!




