### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I encourage all parents to put ten minutes aside each fortnight to read the school newsletter, stay informed and get involved in events and learning programs whenever possible. We are also sending out our Term Overview for parents to put on the fridge.

There is always a lot for the children to participate in and engage with at our school. Staff look forward to a very busy and rewarding term for the children.

### **PUPIL FREE DAY, FRIDAY MAY 12**

You may or may not be aware that under the new teacher agreement brokered between the State Government and representative bodies, Professional Practice days are being phased out. Previously there was one per term or 4 in the school year, taken at varying times in the term, however now there are two days this year, one for each semester which are to be used for report writing purposes. Earlier this year, the Department advised that instead of trying to find relief teachers which are in very short supply, schools could allocate these days on one common day and advertise them as Pupil Free days.

On Monday, our School Council approved Friday May 12 as a day that teachers, as a collective, can take their Professional Practice Day. This is now a Pupil Free day.

This is the best option for this day with Friday, May 19 being Grandparents Junior School Concert and Year 6 Parliament Excursion, and we run into Grade 5 Camp the following week. The day is designated for report writing purposes, therefore the best use of the day is May 12.

### GRANDPARENTS and SPECIAL FRIENDS DAY for JUNIOR SCHOOL

A date to mark in your diary, oour Grandparents and Special Friends Day on Friday May 19. It's great to have it back!

We have changed the format this year as we need the hall for lessons after recess so we have kept the activities to 2.5 hours as in previous years but have made it from the start of the day. ### ANZAC DAY and the HMAS CASTLEMAINE

A special thank you to our Junior School Council, our School Leaders and our Choir for the service they ran on Wednesday here at the school. The flowers that were placed under the flag, have been taken down to the memorial at the base of the 1000 Steps at the Ferntree Gully National Park. As mentioned during the service, we don't celebrate war but we respectfully acknowledge the sacrifices our defence force men and women have made for our country, both in the past and currently on active service.



After our service at school, our school leaders, together with many schools in the local area, attended a service at the memorial based at the 1000 Steps in Ferntree Gully which acknowledges the efforts of the 2/14th, 2/16th and 39th Battalions along the Kokoda track. On behalf of the school, our leaders laid a wreath and 2 of our School Captains spoke about the significance of the 1000 Steps track and the many plaques along the way. We then headed back to the Upwey Belgrave RSL where the children had lunch and then were given access to the amazing museum they have there at the RSL.

On Friday May 5, our Grade 6 children will be heading to the Shrine of Remembrance to take part in a service to remember those that served on the HMAS Castlemaine, a mine sweeper that was in operation during the WW2. This ship was adopted by Tecoma Primary School under the Shrine of Remembrance "Adopt an ex-service organisation." The link to the ship is a former student of our school from the 1930's, Mr Peter Chandler, who served on the HMAS Castlemaine. Peter regularly spoke to our children on various occasions before his passing in 2013. In his honour, and for all those that served, our Grade 6 children hold this service at the Shrine of Remembrance just after ANZAC day every year. These children visited the ship in November last year as part of their leadership program. It will be a great

learning experience for our leaders.

### TEACHING OUR CHILDREN ABOUT ANZAC DAY

There are many ways that parents can get their children involved in the ANZAC Day experience and enable them to gain an understanding of the important place ANZAC holds in Australia's history. Firstly, historical knowledge is important and there are many high quality, child friendly accounts of the ANZAC story, and the ANZAC characteristics that resonate with Australians. Many of these books are



available at local libraries; they are also available through the Department of Veterans' Affairs free of charge. These books make it clear that Anzac Day is not an event glorifying war, but exactly the opposite. It is a time of reflection and remembrance. Endurance, resourcefulness, courage, teamwork, loyalty and mateship are key attributes. These are virtues to be encouraged and emulated at any time and are a part of our national story that we can focus on around ANZAC Day.

There is also the experience of taking your children to a Dawn Service March or other commemorative activities on ANZAC Day. All this will be more meaningful and educational if some of the previous reading and discussion has occurred. In any event, the questions that come from watching a march, studying a war memorial or experiencing the emotional stillness of the minutes silence and bugle call are opportunities to talk about the impact of war on Australia and the significance of the ANZAC Story.

### PREP ENROLMENT

The Department of Education, just prior to the break released its State-wide Enrolment Procedures for children transitioning into Prep in 2024.

Terms 1 and 2, 2023	Primary schools conduct tours and other activities with the recommendation that all tours are completed by the end of term 2.
End of term 1, 2023	School zones for the 2024 school year go live on www.findmyschool.vic.gov.au
From Monday April 24, 2023 onwards	<b>Enrolment applications open</b> – parents/carers may submit their completed 'Application to Enrol in a Victorian Government School' (application form) to a government primary school from this date.
Friday July 28, 2023.	<b>Enrolment applications due</b> – parents/carers submit their completed application form to a government primary school <b>by</b> this date.
By Friday 11 August 2023	Primary schools provide parents/carers with written notification of Foundation (Prep) enrolment outcomes  The Foundation (Prep) Appeal Form should be included with unsuccessful application letters.
By Friday 25 August 2023	Parents/carers sent a <u>letter of offer</u> return the completed enrolment form by this date, to indicate acceptance of their child's enrolment offer.  Closing date for parents/carers to lodge a written appeal with <b>primary school</b> .
By Friday 15 September 2023	Primary schools notify all parents/carers, in writing, of the outcome of appeals by this date.
During Term 4, 2023	Primary schools host transition sessions.  (Tecoma Primary School will shortly advise parents of our transition session dates for term 4.)

The key change to what we have done previously is the dates for our Transition sessions. In past years, we have run these fortnightly from July to give the Pre-school children as much preparation time as possible as a lead into Orientation Day (Tuesday, December 12, 2023) where they meet their teacher for the first time. With this no longer permitted, we will host weekly transition sessions from the first week of Term 4. We will advertise these dates shortly.

### REMINDER ABOUT 2023 CSEF APPLICATIONS

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) helps eligible families with the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card which was valid on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023, you may be eligible. Note the card needs to be in your name and not your child's name.

Payment amounts are \$125 for each eligible primary school student. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any CSEF funding remaining from previous years.

Thank you to parents who have completed and returned their application forms to the office. For anyone eligible who is yet to apply, please call into the school office and ask for an application form. Bring your benefits card as we need to take a photocopy of it to attach to the form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

The closing date for applications is Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2023, however the sooner your application is received and submitted to the Department, the sooner the money will be available for use with upcoming events.

### WINTER IS COMING, SO IS FLU SEASON!
