#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### LAST DAY OF TERM, WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 20, 2023

As you would be aware, next Wednesday is the last day of the school year for the children of Tecoma Primary School.

There will be a final assembly either on the oval, the top basketball court, or the hall (not all children will attend if it's in the hall), commencing at 1:45pm and the children will be **dismissed at 2:30pm** that afternoon. We will let you know by 12:30pm Wednesday where it will be held, after assessing the weather.

Before school care will operate in the morning only on the last day.

#### SCHOOL CROSSING

Our School Crossing Supervisors have reported some instances where vehicles, including those associated with the school, have hurriedly passed through red lights at the crossing. This understandably raises concerns for the safety of pedestrians, particularly our students.

#### REPORTS

On Friday, 15th December, student reports will go 'live' on COMPASS. The Prep-2 children will bring home a reflection sheet whereas this is embedded in the report for Grade 3-6.

The Mathematics and English components of the reports will be based on teachers making judgments of student progress using the Victorian Curriculum in Mathematics and English based on a range of assessment approaches. Your child's teacher has reported against the relevant curriculum area achievement standards based on assessments undertaken and evidence collected.

All reports will contain a comment on what they have achieved in literacy and numeracy, a comment on other curriculum areas, comments from specialist areas, a general comment and show your child's progression on a five-point scale for all subject areas.

We acknowledge that growth in learning looks different for each child. There are times in their schooling when your child may make more than 12 months of learning growth in any one year, whilst at other times they may make 6 months of learning growth for the same period, or even plateau. Any concerns or questions you have about your child's learning should be emailed to your child's classroom teacher.



Thank you again for the ongoing support that you have provided your child and the teachers this semester.




#### GRADE 6 GRADUATION NEXT WEEK
