



GRADES FOR 2024

Each year we go through a full and thoughtful process to make the next year's grades. We take into consideration a broad range of factors and involve both students and staff in this process. Thanks to the parents who responded at the end of last term with parent requests regarding your child's placement. If this related to student separations, we take this into consideration, but our professional judgement will be the determining factor as to whether this request is actioned. We also take into consideration historical factors, that may have been present before. As you can imagine, it is a complex task and shifting one child can create a ripple affect across all the other grades, not to mention attempts to provide friendship groups.

Student Friends in 2024 Classes – Although we ask students to list six friends, they might like to have in their 2024 class, we can't guarantee this. In most cases students will have only one or two of their requests. Trying to accommodate this is not only statistically challenging, but there are also other factors involved. Not to mention teachers input and parent requests. It is not always a great idea to have your best friend in your class, as such we do sometimes split friendships.

Making New Friends in New Class – Sometimes I am contacted by families when their child only gets one of their 'friend' requests, when new classes are announced for the following year. My experience is that by Week Four of the next year, families let me know that their child has made new friends, and still have the old ones. It's part of the student placement process of mixing students across the years, so they can broaden their friendship groups.

On Tuesday 12th December, our Grade 6 students attending Government schools in 2024 will be having their Orientation Day at their new schools. WORKING WITH OUR COMMUNITY

Hopefully you have had an opportunity to see page 10 of this week's Star Mail newspaper. On that page, there is an article written about an Australian Knitting Group who send warm outfits to those in need. One of our grandparents Jenny O'Brien from the Australian Crafters Aid Network (ACAN) puts together packs of comfort items to refugees currently in Poland.

In that pack, they get a jumper, some mittens and a bear with a postcard written by our Grade 5 children. Our children in their creative way, made handmade postcards for the packs with drawings of surfboards and koalas among many symbols unique to Australia but also with well wishes. The feedback ACAN have had previously is that the mothers of the refugee children value the cards even more than the clothes because it shows that somebody cares, which is very powerful for our Grade 5 children.

In previous years, our Grade five children have put packs together and have also helped put stuffing into the knitted bears and those bears went to other refugees.

We look forward to continuing our association with ACAN next year.


