FROM THE PRINCIPAL

WELCOME BACK

As a new school year is upon us I would like to start by welcoming everyone back to school for 2024 and in particular, I'd like to welcome our Preps and new students to the school. The sense of excitement is always palpable, and it was lovely to see Prep classrooms packed with families making the most of what will no doubt be a treasured memory. Hopefully our families made the most of the holiday break and our students are refreshed and ready to learn.

DAY 1

The first day of the school year was a great success, with students from 1-6 settling in exceptionally well and then the Prep children starting today. I would like to thank the staff for making the students feel so at ease, but also acknowledge the work that was put in last year during the transition program. Our students have hit the ground running, which is exactly what we were hoping for! It was also wonderful to see so many parents in and around the school and we hope that this continues! As the week has unfolded, it is already business as usual, and the students are getting on with learning!

WORKS AROUND THE SCHOOL

A lot has happened since the children were last on site.

Through fundraising from last year, including the color run, we have been able to put funds raised towards the following:

- the entry and main corridor of the grade three to six building has been repainted
- new netball/basketball rings and backboards, including four nets, have been installed (a huge thanks to parents Steve Gray and Nathan Amoroso for installing these)
- new monkey bars are on their way for the Grade 3 6 playground, as is new aluminium outdoor furniture for under the outdoor learning space, under the shade sails.

The old mural, created by children of TPS that was situated on the Salvation Army wall, is being installed in the Prep - 2 playground, to create a visual barrier from Burwood Hwy, but also taking away some of the traffic noise.









Unfortunately, we have had some electrical issues with lights on one side of the grade 1/2 building not operating (Electricians were on site at 7.00am yesterday rectifying the problem) while an air conditioner in Grade 3/4 room decided itdidn't want to A massive thank you to all the parents who attended Monday night's Working Bee, where many jobs were completed, including installing blinds, moving 9 metres of sand into the sand pit, cleaning out old rainwater pits that had not been cleared for years, sweeping, and tidying up. We are most appreciative of the support that we receive from our parent community in having the school looking ship-shape for the children when they arrived yesterday. Thank you to everyone who attended.

We were hopeful that the retaining wall and footpath works around our car park would have been completed by the start of the school year, however it looks like it may continue for a little while longer, so we urge families to be cautious around these works until they are complete.

COMMUNICATIONS

Communications will predominantly flow through COMPASS as the first port of call, so I encourage families to make sure they have this app. In terms of student learning, teaching teams will be continuing to use Seasaw Prep-2 and Google Classroom Grades 3-6 in 2024.



"GETTING TO KNOW YOUR CHILD" INTERVIEWS

"Getting to know your child" interviews will be held on Monday February 19 from 1:00pm to 6.00pm.

The purpose of these interviews is twofold. Parents and guardians are encouraged to attend to:

- ⇒ Meet their child's teacher to begin an effective home/school partnership.
- \Rightarrow Provide information to teachers regarding their child's strengths, talents, issues, or concerns. Information shared by parents to teachers will assist us to plan for and work as effectively as possible with you and your child throughout the year. Interviews will be 10 minutes in length.


The school will set up a process where parents are required to book a time online to see a teacher. It is not compulsory to meet your teacher about your child at this stage of the year, but we would certainly like to have met you all; however if a teacher specifically wishes to see certain parents, they will ask for this to occur.

CHANGE OF ASSEMBLY TIME

Last year as a staff, we opened a discussion around the timing of our assemblies. In my time here, assemblies have always been at 9:00am on a Monday morning, which has worked well as it sets up the week. Why that time of the week? Probably because that is the way it has always been done. Assembly has been the time where we hand out our "Student of the Week" recognition awards and discuss the week ahead.

In these discussions, we talked about whether this was the best use of time, considering that the children are losing 30 minutes of their literacy block time each week, at a time when they are most likely to be at their most alert and is their prime learning time.

We discussed this with School Council and at Parent Network to get their views.



Considering what we think is our core business and that is to maximize every opportunity of learning time, we have decided to move assemblies to Friday afternoons at 3.00pm. The format won't change, in that we will have the children still receiving their awards and they will be able to hand their certificates to their parents as they leave to head off for the weekend break.

Parents will still be informed that their child has received a Student of the Week but these will not be handed out until the following Friday, giving the parents 8 days' notice that their child will be presented with their certificate.

Please look out for the weekly notifications to see whether your child is receiving their certificate so that you can make appropriate arrangements to attend.

GRADE 6 BOMBER JACKET and LEADERSHIP BADGES

Now that I have said that we are having our assemblies on Friday afternoons, I am now going to introduce an exception! This Monday morning, we will be presenting, in front of the school community, the Grade 6 bomber jackets and Leadership badges. This will take longer than half an hour so we will run this on Monday morning, as we have in previous years.

It is always a special occasion for the children to receive their leadership badges and Grade 6 bomber jackets/polos, as it signifies the final year of their primary school journey.

We hope you can make it along on Monday, on the top basketball court, for an outdoor assembly, weather permitting.

2024 PARENT CONTRIBUTIONS REMINDER

Parent payments help the school to operate effectively. At TPS, we continue to keep our contributions very low, however those additional funds are the difference between providing the additional programs, such as a significant investment in technology, that cannot be delivered without the support of families. We would like to thank the parents that have already made these contributions and strongly encourage all families to do what they can. SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Council approves external contracts, provides advice and consent on a range of areas, and oversees school finance. ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL

As in previous years, students should be arriving before 8:57am (when the music starts) so that they can enter their classroom and be ready for learning at 9.00am.

Staff are not on duty until 8:45am and students who enter the school's grounds prior to this are unsupervised and at risk. In previous years we saw a growing number of students entering the grounds as early as 8.00am, without adult supervision. For families where both parents work and therefore need to drop off their children prior to 8:45am, the school provides an Out of School Hours Care program that runs from 7.00am to 6.00pm.

All students arriving after 9.00am must sign in at the office.

Parents are welcome on site at any time. We only ask that parents remain out of the classrooms prior to school starting, as staff prepare for the day ahead. It is also important for students to build their resilience and part of this is entering the rooms on their own (with the exception of Preps in the first week or so).

Any students remaining at school at 3:45pm will be escorted to the office at the front of the school for collection. It is expected that students who are not collected by 3:45pm are registered for out of school hours care, so that they can be placed in care if families cannot collect their children by 3:45pm.

CAR PARKING

Just a reminder about the carparking in and around the surrounding areas of the school. Our school carpark is open in the morning and has a drop off bay outside the hall. If the carpark is full there are spaces available for parents to park on Burwood Hwy, in behind the Salvation Army and Bon—Ton and the church next door. There is a small number of spaces available on McNicol Rd however please be aware parking inspectors were out and about last year booking cars for being parked in the wrong areas.



Our carpark works extremely well in the afternoon when the pickup bay is not used for parking; please only stop in the drop off bay when you see your child waiting there. If you do not see you child there, please do another loop. If your child is at an age where they need assistance to get in the car, carry their bags or need help with seatbelts etc, then please don't use the drop off bay.

It works really well when we all do the right thing.

It ensures the traffic keeps flowing and leads to much less frustration for all road users.

The preschool carpark is for kinder parents only. This is also the case at the Imaging and Audiology Centre on the corner of Burwood Hwy and McNicol Rd due to the Emergency Vehicles (eg Ambulances) that might need access to the premises. Please be respectful that these carparks are not ours and should not be used by our community as such. Thanks for your assistance.

LUNCH ORDERS

Lunch orders are available on Wednesday and Fridays only at this stage via the QKR app. Orders can be placed from Sushi Express or the Blacksmith in Belgrave.

UP TO DATE DETAILS

If your child is ill at school, or suffers an accident, then staff will give immediate care and appropriate first aid. Please make sure you notify the office of any changes to your address, your Emergency Contact details, as well as mobile phone numbers. Please also keep the office informed of any change in medical issues faced by your children, as this helps us to make the best choices for their welfare. Your up-to-date contact information is especially important for us for when we need to contact you in the case of an emergency e.g. bushfire.

LABOUR DAY PUBLIC HOLIDAY

Parents are reminded that there is a Labour Day Public holiday on Monday 11th March. There will be no school on this day.

ART SMOCKS

To protect clothing, all students are requested to have an Art Smock or old shirt that can be worn during art classes.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)

We encourage and value parental and community support at TPS. There are many ways that parents, grandparents, and friends can assist at our school. We encourage all parents to obtain a Working with Children's Check that will allow you to be very involved in your child's education. These checks are free for volunteers. Once you have your WWCC please come to the office so we can photocopy this, and we will add your name to our list of parents who have a current WWCC check.

ANNUAL PRIVACY REMINDER

Our school collects, uses, discloses and stores student and parent personal information for standard school functions or where permitted by law, as stated in the Schools' Privacy Policy. ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The Department of Education (DE) does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents are generally responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. The Department of Education states that reasonable low-cost accident insurance policies are available from the commercial insurance sector. Similarly, DE (which includes the school) does not offer replacement of personal items which are brought to school and are lost, broken, or stolen. Sentimental or expensive belongings and toys, including sports equipment and electronic devices, are normally best left at home.

MOBILE PHONES



Readers of the newsletter would be aware of the introduction of the state-wide policy on Mobile Phones in Victorian Government Schools. All students are required to turn off and hand in mobile phones to prevent usage during school hours. This also extends to smart watches where the call and messaging function can connect to the student's phone. We have electronic safes to secure the devices in for each classroom in the Grade 3-6 areas. Phones will be placed in the safe at the start of the day and handed back at the end of the day. If students in Prep-2 have a mobile phone, this will need to be handed to their classroom teacher or to the school office. School Council has approved our Mobile Phone policy to ensure it is aligned to DE directives. A copy of this policy is available on our website. Please discuss this with your

child/ren to assist us in following this policy. We thank you for your support in this area.

STUDENT SAFETY - BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY PROCEDURES @ TECOMA PS

We were told it was going to be a hot, dry summer but to this stage, it has been anything but........ however we may get a late run of hot weather. With that in mind, we need to remind all that we live in the Dandenong Ranges which classifies our school on the 'Bushfire At Risk Register'. It is vital you are aware of the following information:

SCHOOL CLOSURES ON CATASTROPHIC DAYS

Should there be a predicted "CATASTROPHIC" day school community members will be notified three days prior to the predicted closure to inform them. One day prior to the closure day(s) another alert, letter/phone call will confirm the closure. If the school is closed, nobody will be on site. This includes all staff and students. As the Out of School Hours Care Program will also be closed families will be required to make alternate arrangements for such days. It is recommended that you enact your fire plans on these days.

Active Fire Procedures:

In the event of an active fire occurring in the area all students will be evacuated to our safer place which is our school hall. Parents will be notified should we ever evacuate to the hall. We ask that you do not come to the school to collect your children, at this time, as the potential for traffic closures and hazards in such conditions could result in tragic consequences as was the case in the Black Saturday fires. Please note that the school's Safer Place is not a community refuge, and we discourage you from using it as a plan of action in your family's emergency management plan. Many parents will choose to enact their family fire plans well before a real threat is faced. This may mean leaving the local area the day before a day of extreme heat and/ or wind. Of course, this decision lies with each family and should mean that your route down the Highway is not blocked or impeded as may be the case if a fire was in the area.



VISITING THE SCHOOL and CHLDREN COLLECTION AT THE END OF THE DAY

A reminder to everyone that we have a policy which requires all visitors to report to the office first when entering the school. Should you need to visit the classroom, see your child at recess or are a helper at school, please report to the office first to sign in. This ensures that in an emergency we can account for all people at school.

If you are having someone collecting your children that is not on your emergency contact list or does not normally pick up your child, can you please let the office know. This is especially important for the junior children, as we release the children from their class for the day.

SUN SMART

During term one, please remember that hats are compulsory at all times when outside at school (including Phys Ed sessions). As a Sunsmart school we strictly enforce the use of hats.



Remember these 5 SunSmart steps during the sun protection times, even if it's cool or cloudy.

- 1. Slip on covering clothing. If you can see skin, UV can reach it.
- 2. Slop on SPF 30 or higher broad-spectrum sunscreen. Apply sunscreen before going outdoors.
- 3. *Slap on a sun protective hat*. The best hat shades the head, face, eyes, ears, and neck. Our school hats comply with Sun Smart regulations.
- 4. **Seek shade**. Shady spaces help block some of the sun's UV but not all so you still need to wear hats, clothing, and sunscreen even in the shade.
- 5. **Slide on sunglasses**. If practical, help protect your child's eyes with sunglasses.

Students who don't have a Sun Smart hat will be directed to play in a designated shade area.

HOT WEATHER

On days of extreme heat, students will remain in their classrooms with all staff sharing the supervision of grades. This will only apply to days of extreme and excessive heat and will operate similarly to the wet day timetable.

We have also been asked to remind our parent community about the dangers of leaving children in cars on very hot days.
