WORKS AROUND THE SCHOOL

In the past four weeks we have had a lot of work done around the school. Over summer, the first stage of painting the senior building was having the hallway painted. In the April break, we had the 3 classrooms on the basketball court side of the senior building, including the back offices, all painted. In the June break, we will have the left hand side (church side) of the building going down the corridor, including all three classrooms and back offices, painted.

This week we have had our external lighting checked and upgraded where needed. Last weekend we had some landscaping done, where we had some large rocks moved to create some garden beds, which will now be planted out. However we have bigger news regarding our environment and sustainability projects around the school.

WE HAVE BEEN NAMED AS A FINALIST IN THE RESOURCESMART SCHOOLS AWARDS!

The ResourceSmart Schools Awards celebrate the legendary efforts and impacts made by schools in sustainability. Our school and sustainability team under the leadership of Mrs. Langford and Miss Lansdell has been recognised as a finalist for the Community Leadership School of the Year. This category recognises schools that best demonstrate a commitment to community leadership through the encouragement of innovative sustainability practices and action on climate change.

We are one of 3 schools in the finals and the information we have received as to why we have received this recognition is as follows:

"This Sustainability Action Team partners with community to enhance biodiversity. Working with local groups, like Treasure our Trees, students improve and maintain gardens, including an indigenous garden with Australian Native Food plants and a yarning circle. Working with Clean Up Australia Day volunteers, the group cleaned up the rail trail from Tecoma to Belgrave. While at school students educate their peers on waste management, manage worm farms and chickens, and sell eggs to fundraise for future garden projects."

Well done our wonderful sustainability team of teachers, children and parents. We cannot wait until June 4!

OUR MATHS PUPIL FREE DAY LAST FRIDAY

Our staff engaged in a very productive Curriculum Day on Friday, with Mathematics curriculum a major focus of the day. Maths Consultant, Mick Ymer, took us through numerous activities that covered differentiation of topics within the Maths curriculum along with planning documentation. In 2025, our school will be fully implementing the new Victorian Curriculum for Mathematics. Our work over coming months will include developing a revised and updated Scope and Sequence for the teaching of Mathematics at Tecoma PS, along with deepening the teaching and learning of the 'Big Ideas' in Mathematics, such as understanding place value, counting and multiplicative thinking skills. STUDENT ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY

Students in Grades 4, 5 and 6 will be participating in the 2024 Student Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS) this year. We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting this survey to find out what your child thinks of their school.

The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at Tecoma Primary School during Term 2.

What are the benefits?

Young people enjoy having a say! This survey has been running for nearly 20 years and is invaluable in helping schools understand student views to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. The survey responses also help the Department of Education understand how student's learning experiences can be improved.

Di Double and I conduct the survey with the children so that we have consistency in how it is delivered across our school. Please contact the school if you have any questions about this survey.

We have been named as a finalist in the ResourceSmart Schools Awards!

The ResouceSmart Schools Awards celebrate the legendary efforts and impacts made by schools in sustainability. Our school has been chosen as a finalist in the Community Leadership School of the Year (Primary) category for our work on working with the local community on our future Yarning Circle and Indigenous Garden, and Clean Up Australia Day.

We have been invited to attend the awards ceremony at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on 4 June along with the other finalists. The theme this year is **"Legendary legacies – what will you leave behind?"** Speaking of legendary legacies, since 2008, 1,600 ResourceSmart Schools (including us!) have worked together to:

- save more than \$60 million on bills
- plant more than 5.2 million trees
- save more than 74,000 tonnes of CO2e greenhouse gas emissions
- divert 168,000 cubic metres of waste from landfill
- save 1.8 million kilolitres of water.

The ResourceSmart Schools Awards are a joyful and affirming celebration of schools and students and their sustainability triumphs. The awards are the state's largest sustainability celebration for primary and secondary school students, teachers and school volunteers taking remarkable sustainability action. We are proud to be recognised among the schools doing sustainability work that benefits students, the planet and the wider community alike.
