FORTNIGHTLY UPDATE

Last edition, we mentioned how our Sustainability Team were heading to the MCG to see how we went in the Sustainability Victoria Awards.

We are very proud to say that we came out as the winner for the Sustainability Victoria Community Leadership School of the Year, which is an absolute credit to all that have been involved over the past few years, none more so than Mrs. Langford who has led our teams of children and parents over the past few years to get to this point. Our student leaders in receiving the award, spoke wonderfully to the audience in the MCG dining room. We have much to do in the environment space, but we know we are in good hands with leaders such as the ones that represented us last week.

Finishing touches are being put to our school reports. These go out to you via compass on Friday June 21. Parent/Teacher interviews are being held on Tuesday June 25. Details about how to book for those were sent out yesterday via COMPASS. I have elaborated further below.

Our children in Grade 3-4 have been extremely busy constructing shelters and these will be on display in the corridor of the Grade 3-6 building for parents to see when they come up for Parent/Teacher interviews in the last week of term. Please take the time, either side of your interview, to have a look at the wonderful work that they have put together.

Our children continue to rehearse for the State School Spectacular that is being held in September at John Cain arena. This follows on from the children performing at the Northeast Victoria Region concert at Hamer Hall two weeks ago. We are very fortunate to have a teacher in Mrs. Connell who gives the children such wonderful opportunities to perform in the public arena.

Congratulations to all our children, mainly in Grade 5-6, with some extra support from some Grade 4 children, in how you represented our school at our inter school sports last Friday. We have a strong belief that school sport is about giving children the opportunity to enjoy playing sport with their friends and a "taster" for some of those children that don't do sport on weekends. It's not about winning or losing but the manner in which we play which is far more important. That taster might lead to them wanting to pursue one of our fantastic local clubs in the sport that they desire, which can only be a good thing. Our children played the games in the manner that we would expect, showing all our school values and in the sport that I was at (soccer), our teams encouraged the other schools while playing them on field, which was wonderful to see. Good luck to our netball, soccer and T-ball teams that have advanced to the next stage of competition.

Thank you to Mrs. Cumming and all our teachers/parents/coaches for your efforts in supporting our children, leading up to the events, and also on the day.

You will have seen some temporary fencing being placed around the school on Wednesday morning. In the checks that we do around the school, we noticed that the strong winds had left a branch hanging in the courtyard near our time capsule, there was also a branch that came down on the oval and the winds were so strong that they blew the finial off the top of the gazebo. The Department of Education will be sending out contractors with a cherry picker to be able to fix that one, an arborist will deal with the branches, but in the meantime those areas have been cordoned off.

A notice is coming out today asking for any parental support at our working bee to be held on Saturday June 22 from 9:00am to 2:00pm.

If any parent has an auger to dig holes for our eight goal posts, can you please let me know, as at the working bee, we will be digging the holes out in preparation for the installation of the goal posts the following day.

The goal posts were purchased from funds raised by the parent network in the colour run last year and I know that the children are very keen to see them installed.

Unfortunately, the winter bugs continue to hit our staff and children; a reminder to **please** keep kids home if they aren't well as this may prevent others from also catching these winter bugs.

PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

As mentioned above, Parent/Teacher Interviews will be held for all parents on Tuesday June 25th from 12 noon to 7:45pm in person. This was sent out via COMPASS yesterday and bookings opened this morning. If you haven't made an appointment or need assistance with the booking system, please contact the office. Once a time slot is filled, the time slot is automatically withdrawn to prevent double bookings. During this 15-minute interview, parents will have a chance to explore information with the teacher that has been presented in the Mid-Year Report, which will be forwarded to parents on Friday 21st June. I strongly recommend that all parents avail themselves to this opportunity to further enhance your child's progress at school. The positive partnership parents set up and foster with school has many benefits for the continued learning and engagement at school of their child/ren. This parent-teacher

interview process not only ensures our communicative and collaborative processes continue to operate effectively, but also provides your child with the best opportunity to succeed.

MID-YEAR REPORTING/PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Our teaching staff have been very busy over the past month writing mid-year reports for each student. It's an extremely busy time for teachers, the task taking around 40-50 hours. However, we know that this is an important opportunity for parents to be updated on their child's progress, so it's undertaken with a high degree of diligence. Each report once drafted, goes through two rounds of proofreading to ensure we maintain our high standards. We are focused on reporting in a clear and concise style without too much teacher jargon.

Features of our reports for those new to our school are:

- We report on your child's citizenship, and we are doing this through the lens of our new school values. (Respect, Creativity, Personal Best and Resilience)
- A general comment space is included.
- Achievements and areas for improvement are in the one comment.
- We have several learning indicators for specialist reports (CLIL Content and Language Integrated Learning Science & Japanese) along with effort and behaviour.
- There are no A-E scores. We focus on a growth mindset.

When you get the report, please remember that we have begun the process of writing reports in May. This is especially pertinent for parents of Prep children. A Prep child has been with us for 4 months, so unless we are totally satisfied, they have made 6 months growth in their learning progression, we won't move them up the graph. It doesn't mean your child hasn't made growth; it's just that they might not have shown 6 months growth in

the 4 months they have been with us. This is but one example as to why you should take advantage of the parent teacher interviews on offer.

For most students, their progress in Reading provides a reasonable indicator of how they are progressing in most aspects of the curriculum which is why we have so much of a focus on developing sight vocabulary and regular reading habits. For Prep students in Victoria the reading benchmark at the end of the year is level 5, whilst for Year 1 students it is level 15. All students develop at different rates, so this is merely an indicator of how they are progressing, and it is far better for us to develop students' ability to expand their comprehension, expression and fluency, rather than merely just reading a certain level of book.

PLANNING WEEK

At Tecoma, all our teachers work collaboratively in teaching teams to provide support and maintain collective responsibility for all students in their level. To support this work, next week we have planning week where all teachers are released from their teaching duties for one day. This provides time for teachers to further analyse student progress and complete preliminary planning for the term to come. Over the next weeks and over the holidays, all teachers complete their term level planning, which is then used as the foundation for weekly and daily planning throughout the term, ensuring that our teachers are prepared well in advance for another fantastic term of learning.

2025 SCHOOL ENROLMENT

Thank you to parents and extended family members, with a kinder aged child, who have already submitted their 2025 enrolment form. I continue to conduct tours and accept enrolments weekly.

Should parents have siblings attending our school next year, but have not yet enrolled, NOW is the right time to do so. Enrolments can be entered on the VicStudents portal:


