AROUND THE SCHOOL

You will have seen over the past two weeks a number of trades working around the school. After a number of years of continual patching, the Department of Education, through the Victorian School Building Authority, agreed to replace:

- ⇒ the roof above the cleaners cupboard, the Prep teacher office and the Prep store room
- ⇒ the roof above the girls toilets and the walkway in front
- ⇒ repair the finial above the gazebo out the front.

An arborist has given the all clear on the trees where branches were hanging that caused us to ring make safe in the first place. All of this work should be completed by the end of this week which will mean that all of the temporary fencing will be removed.

In other news:

- Congratulations to the Preps on how you have started your swimming lessons. I was there yesterday to assist, and what a well oiled machine they are.
- Watch out for the morning munchies that is being held on August 23rd. This is the same day as "Book Character Day." We will have a parade at 9:00am for the kids to display their favourite book character costume.
- As mentioned last newsletter, bugs have hit staff and children already. We have on most occasions been able to cover classes but with such a teacher shortage, we can't always guarantee that and we may have to split classes. That will be our last resort.
- The Grade 3, 4 and 5 children are in the final stages of preparing for their camp on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday next week. The Grade 3/4 children are heading off to Forest Edge, and the Grade 5 children are heading off to the Urban Camp. Please check all communications you have received from your camp leaders and if you aren't sure, please contact your child's class teacher. We will need the children here on Wednesday with everything they require and on time for a prompt departure.



CARPARK

We have had some feedback once again regarding the use of our car park, especially after school which is more congested than in the mornings.

The drop off bay is a stop, collect and go, it is not a stop, park and hop out to try and find your children.

Over the holidays, we had all of our line marking redone to show very clearly the parking areas and what is the "drop off bay". This includes a new disabled carpark, adjacent to the drop off bay. It has been reported that we have had some people creating their own car parks which severely restricts the flow of cars trying to revolve around the carpark. If you cannot see your child waiting at the fence of the drop off bay, please do another loop until they appear.

We will endeavour to have a staff member down there each night when possible to supervise and assist the collection of your children to their cars when they see their parents car approaching the drop off bay. Please do not ask your children to walk in amongst the cars to meet you in the car park from the front entry near the letterbox. Like everywhere, car parks can be dangerous with blind spots and a driver just may not see a child weaving in amongst cars to get to your car.

We will do everything to assist in the smooth collection of your children but we need your assistance with this as well. Thanks for your cooperation.
