# HOLIDAYS

On our favorite sporting team day on the last day of Term 3, there were a few Brisbane Lions' fans, so no doubt the middle weekend gave them much joy. For the rest of us, there is always next year....or next decade!

# FLORAL CARPET

As you would be aware from our notification earlier this week and via COMPASS just before the holidays, the "floral carpet", a tradition of our school in the 1950s, 60's and 70's is back in 2024 as part of the 100-year celebration of the Tecoma railway station and village.

This was a feature of the school way back, being held on the Melbourne Cup weekend with it being advertised in the major newspapers and people flocking from all over the city to come and see this, so we know we have big shoes to fill!

The children have been collecting stems of colourful plants and flowers from their own gardens (or those of agreeable neighbours or public places) and brought them in this morning in takeaway containers. Times have changed! Apparently, back in the day, the children brought the flowers in on saucers. I'm not sure how many children would know what a saucer is these days!

At point, I was fossicking around underneath the school building and found a floral carpet sign. It comes with an old cord with a bayonet connection to plug into a lampshade! We were able to get it out and we are hopeful that with an electrician's help we can get this 60-year-old artifact working and on display tomorrow.



It was lovely to see the excitement of the children as they brought their arrangements into the hall and the hall now smells like a florist!

The kids' creations and contributions will be used either directly in the actual carpet, or as display pieces on the day of the floral carpet event.

The schedule for tomorrow is as follows:

9am – 12pm: the general public viewing which takes in our cake stall and tea/coffee in the hall.

12pm - 3:30pm: Children, staff and parents

4pm - 7pm: All community members can view the carpet while taking advantage of the sausage sizzle on offer

I want to acknowledge the efforts of our wonderful community in baking for our cake stall. I also want to acknowledge the huge effort and planning put together by our parent network members, many of whom are part of the 100 years of Tecoma celebration committee which have been meeting almost monthly now for the past 12 months in the planning of the events this term.

Please make sure you pop into the hall at some stage tomorrow and see what the children's donations have turned into. Thank you for your wonderful support.

# **STAFFING AND GRADE STRUCTURES FOR 2025**

I cannot believe we are at this time of year, but we are now looking at structures for 2025.

Throughout November and early December, we will be working on our class structures and student combinations for next year. Changes in student numbers and staffing combinations usually cause us to reshape our proposed class structures several times throughout this term.

We have several staff placements that may or may not be a part of our 2025 staff team, with various interview processes to occur.

At this stage, we hope to hold 16 classes next year for what is expected to be around 370 children. However, we need definite numbers across all levels before we make that decision.

Due to this, it is vital that we are made aware of any circumstances that may impact on our enrolment numbers. Please let us know urgently if you intend to enrol a child at our school, if you are aware of people in our community who will be enrolling or if you intend to move house, therefore transfer to another school. We desperately require this information as soon as possible in order to establish grade structures for the start of the new school year. If you will not be at Tecoma in 2025, please notify the school office in writing as soon as possible.

# What are the criteria that we use to make up class lists?

Factors influencing class structure are:

- the educational needs of the students;
- the projected number of students in each year level;
- the ratio of girls to boys;
- the number of teachers employed at the school; and
- resources and facilities.

# Factors which are considered in the placement of students include:

- academic performance judgments over time
- work habits eg ability to work independently
- behaviour
- Gender balance
- social network /friendships
- social maturity
- special needs eg twins, siblings.

# What is the process for placing students into classes?

Based on the criteria listed above, teaching staff and administration meet mid-term 4 to establish classes for the following school year.

Teachers ensure each new class has:

- a balance of academic ability
- gender balance
- socially balanced groups

During this process, changes and adjustments are made over several weeks. Each change may trigger a chain reaction of other changes.

Proposed class lists are submitted to the me and Assistant Principal, Di Double for final ratification.

At this stage, the new classes will be announced on the proposed Orientation Day, Tuesday, December 10.

# 2025 GRADE PLACEMENT REQUESTS

Parents are now invited to write to me about any concerns they may have for their child's educational needs for 2025.

<u>Please note, requests for particular teachers will not be considered as the best interests of all of the children and the effective management of the school must be taken into account.</u>

## Letters will be considered up until 4:00pm, Friday November 1, 2024.

Letters received after this date will not be accepted unless in exceptional circumstances.

These letters are to be addressed directly to myself with all details and information provided kept in confidence.

While I have letters on file from previous years, **I will only be considering letters I receive this year**. Often friendship concerns become outdated as the children grow in maturity and have developed new friendships. However, if you have information from previous years that you feel I need to know that is relevant regarding your child's placement, please include this in your letter. Please don't assume I know!

As you may understand, the allocating of children to classrooms is a very complex task and one that requires patience and a great deal of thought and manipulation. Please assist us to make this process as smooth as possible by taking note of the requests as outlined. Please also be aware that requests are indeed requests and does not mean it will automatically happen. This is done with all the information that we have at our disposal and every decision will be made for the betterment of all children. Should you wish to discuss any concerns with 2025 grade placements, please contact the school office to arrange a time for a chat.

# EXTREME & CATASTROPHIC FIRE DANGER DAYS

Our school is one of many schools across Victoria that is a Bushfire at Risk school. Like all Bushfire at Risk Schools, we are closed on any declared Catastrophic Day.

Information about the current and expected Fire Danger Ratings can be found in weather forecasts on daily news programs, published on websites and in newspapers, broadcast on radio and on the CFA website.

With fire season fast approaching and, it is a good time to remind our families to ensure that all your details are up to date at the school. We know that a number of families circumstances have changed recently, and we require the most up to date records to ensure we can contact you. If you have changed address, got a new phone number or have a new alternative contact, please contact the office to give us the details so that we are able to contact you if required.

# **SUNSMART**

A reminder that as the UV levels increase at this time of year, we need to be SunSmart! The Cancer Council recommend a combination of sun protection measures:

1. Slip on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.

2. Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ (or higher) sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go



outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.

3. Slap on a hat – broad brim or legionnaire style to protect your face, head, neck and ears.

4. Seek shade.

5. Slide on some sunglasses – make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Our Sun Smart Policy specifies that all students must wear a sun smart hat whenever they are outdoors at school. Please support our Sun Smart policy by providing a 'sun smart' hat for your child. Hats are available for purchase at the uniform shop.

The money now goes back to the community, via discounted Grade 6 uniform for the Grade 5 students and discounted Graduation costs for the Grade















The next step in our SWPBS action plan, is to introduce a consistent acknowledgement system in each of the classes. The Junior School Council, with the help of Miss Ward, designed a 'punch card' that is used for in-class rewards. When a student receives 10 ticks on their positive behaviour board, they will receive a pom pom to take to the office to vote for their whole-school reward, as well as a 'punch' on their card. The student can choose from a menu of smaller rewards to have in their classroom, or they may like to save up their 'punches' for a larger in-class reward. 
