FLORAL CARPET

I hope many of you got the opportunity to come up and be part of the return of the Tecoma Primary School Floral Carpet.

One of the risks but also the exciting part of bringing back something that has been integral to our school from the 1950's into the 1980's was the big shoes that we had to fill in making sure that our carpet measured up against previous efforts.

I would like to say that we did that and more with what we were able to put together, not just as a school community, but also past students, members of the church community next door and the members of the '100 years of Tecoma Celebrations'.

Involving the children by introducing a colour competition at assembly sparked them into action and then being able to send home containers with sand for them to bring along flowers made them very much a part of what we were able to do.

The 3.6m x 3.6m carpet turned out just superbly with the sea of colour and the fragrance as you entered the hall. Whilst the result was outstanding, my favorite part was seeing our kids working with adults, including our past students, in putting together this project. Some of them had tears of joy as it brought back so many memories of the 30 years that they made the carpet here - in what is now our staff room. We had images of those past carpets showing up on the screen along with pictures of our township, going through the ages, keeping people at the tables having their free tea and coffee.

We had terrific coverage from the Star Mail and from Yarra Ranges life TV where our children featured and it was a perfect time for us to have our Facebook page up and running!

It's a risk to individualise, but I would like to pay a huge thank you to Chuck Page and Kym Cinel, who are not only parents at our school, but also members of the Tecoma 100-year celebrations, who led this. Their enthusiasm brought our community together, along with members outside of our community, who came in to assist. I've heard nothing but good reports about what was produced, and we can only say thank you to everyone involved.

Thank you to all who helped with the construction on Thursday, with parents, community members and children all helping to put each flower into the bed of sand to make a sea of colour.

Thank you also to everyone who did baking, as this combined with donations and the sausage sizzle amounted to nearly \$2000 in fundraising, which we are directing towards the history trail.

There has been discussion about whether we do this again, but I would suggest it should be done every two years, either side of our school production. That, however, is something we can work on in our planning for the future.




