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# CONTAINER DEPOSIT SCHEME – IMPROVING OUR SCHOOL

A huge thank you to the families and neighbours in our community who donate their CDS containers to our school. So far this year we have cashed in over \$300. Mrs Langford and the Sustainability Leaders collect the containers and fill her car every fortnight before she heads to Upwey Bowls, who kindly donate their containers as well. This scheme is supporting our garden and sustainability program by raising the final funds to complete our Yarning Circle, due to be installed next week, and will then fund the lunchtime garden club program to buy chook food, seedlings, soil enrichment, tools and much more.

How can you help? Simply bring your bag of CDS containers to school and place them in one of the **BIG RED bins** on either side of the 1/2 building or if you take them to a depot yourself simply scan the schools code below.



NOTE: Small containers under 150ml like energy shots and Yakult are not accepted even though they show the 10c labels. Here is what is accepted:

### **Container eligibility**



#### **Eligible containers**

Most small portable beverage containers between 150mL and 3L. Check for the 10c mark on the drink container label.

- Aluminium cans
- Plastic bottles
- Glass bottles
- Paperboard cartons (under 1L)
- Steel bottles/cans

Your containers should be uncrushed and lids can be kept on.



#### **Ineligible containers**

- Wine and spirit bottles
- Milk containers
- Paper cartons (over 1L)
- Cordial bottles

Don't throw these out! Ineligible containers may still be accepted in your kerbside recycling bin.

### **RUBBISH FREE LUNCH:**
