Students are nominated by their peers for the role of School Captain. They were required to present a speech to the current Grade 5/6 cohort, teachers, Di Double and myself. Voting took place by ballot at the completion of the speeches.

The Role of School Captain is set out as follows:

Represent Tecoma Primary School and its students with distinction.

Lead and organise weekly assemblies.

Respond to requests from Principal and teachers.

Escort visitors around our school with confidence and good manners.

Use initiative to catch up on lessons missed due to representing our school.

Show responsibility to carry out specific jobs once learnt without having to be reminded

Exhibit the confidence and maturity required to speak in front of a large audience at events. These may include assemblies, impromptu speeches for special visitors and special events.

TAKE HOME BOOKS:

In talking to our literacy leaders, we are missing a substantial amount of the take home and library books that the children read. Can you please look under the bed, in the car, bedroom, school bags, under the mattress; anywhere that you think might be a likely spot where these books might have disappeared to and send them back to the school so we can continue to re-circulate them.

SCHOOL UNIFORM (INCLUDING HAT'S)

There has been a significant increase in students attending school without the correct uniform over recent weeks. It is a requirement for all students to be in the correct school uniform, including the school hat. Our uniform shop has a full range of stock on hand you can purchase. Hopefully we can see a return to full uniform next week.

Finally, currently there is a significant amount of misplaced uniform items in the lost property containers, which are located just outside the staff room in the main building. We ask that all uniform items are named so that if we do pick them up, they can be returned quickly and we encourage families to check the bags and tubs to see if any of their lost items are there.

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

During the months of October to December, areas of Victoria are particularly prone to bouts of combined pollen and weather conditions that can result in 'Thunderstorm Asthma' in children and adults. On days of high risk of Thunderstorm Asthma at school, staff carefully consider conditions, and may have some outdoor activities relocated indoors (such as PE) to limit the of conditions that could student having potential impact result in а Thunderstorm Asthma. For students prone to Asthma, Hayfever, or who take regular preventative medication, families are encouraged to monitor these sites (as does the school) and ensure children have their medication (named) at the school office, in case it is needed.

STUDENT WELLBEING

With the warmer weather arriving earlier this year with El Nino on our doorstep, (33 degrees yesterday!), now is a good time to remind students and parents about drink bottles. In order for our brains to function at their best, hydration is essential. At TPS, we encourage students to have a drink bottle on their table and of course, we have fountains to drink from when outside. We all know that dehydration leads to fatigue, headaches and other physically draining symptoms that interfere with learning. In order for each child to give themselves the best chance at a productive day, drinking plenty of water is the healthy and sensible solution.

I've also spoken to all the children about the use of the breaks before school, recess and lunch time for going to the toilet. Habits crept in during remote learning and there has been a continual procession of children going to the toilet 5 minutes into learning time.

I've used the analogy of what mum and dad would say as you're about to head off on your family road trip for a holiday. The last thing they would say before hopping into the care is "have you gone to the toilet?" as they don't want to be stopping every 10 minutes on their road trip. School is the same. No teacher is going to stop the children from going to the toilet but we're trying to get them to go during the breaks instead to maximise the most of their learning time.

REMEMBRANCE DAY:



On Friday, 11th November students and staff will commemorate Remembrance Day which is a significant day in Australia. Remembrance Day commemorates the noble sacrifices of armed forces and civilians during times of war. At the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, one minute silence is observed across the country to mark the end of hostilities on the Western front during WW1 after four years of warfare.

Poppies are available from the office with all proceeds going to the RSL.
