#### **100 YEARS OF TECOMA RAILWAY STATION AND VILLAGE**

I hope you were able to get up to the school on Sunday to be part of the celebrations of the 100 year anniversary of the opening of the Tecoma Railway Station and naming of the township.

Pupil free day

We opened our Indigenous Garden and Yarning Circle which has been the culmination of at least two years of work by Environment Leader, Mrs. Deb Langford and her team, and also fundraising from our Parent Network.

The crowd gathered around our Yarning Circle as we had a moving "Welcome to Country" from local Indigenous member Stacie Piper. We then heard about the history of the area from the historian and researcher of the Sherbrooke Foothills Historical Society, Anita Walker, who gave us some information around the origins of the naming of the township and also some history around some of the checkpoints in our history trail that we have created at our school. We also heard from our Local (Peter McIlwain), State (Daniella Di Martino) and Federal (Aaron Violi) politicians before we officially declared the Yarning Circle and Indigenous Garden open.

We then headed up to the front area of the school where we officially opened our history trail. We are very proud of what the Student History Leaders have done in creating what I believe will be the first stage of many checkpoints around our school.

Thanks to the generous donations of the Bendigo Bank and also the McKenzie family who have a long history with our school, we are able to start to preserve the long 124 year history of our school in a history trail format.

Local community groups had displays of what they do in our area. We also had pictorial history on display thanks to the Sherbrooke Foothills Historical Society.

A special thank you to the organising committee headed by Chuck Page and Kym Cinel for organising the event.



#### **REPORTS**

On Friday, 13th December, student reports will go 'live' on COMPASS. The Prep-2 children will bring home a reflection sheet whereas this is embedded in the report for Grade 3-6.

The Mathematics and English components of the reports will be based on teachers making judgments of student progress using the Victorian Curriculum in Mathematics and English based on a range of assessment approaches. Your child's teacher has reported against the relevant curriculum area achievement standards based on assessments undertaken and evidence collected. All reports will contain a comment on what they have achieved in literacy and numeracy, a comment on other curriculum areas, comments from specialist areas, a general comment and show your child's progression on a five-point scale for all subject areas.

We acknowledge that growth in learning looks different for each child. There are times in their schooling when your child may make more than 12 months of learning growth in any one year, whilst at other times they may make 6 months of learning growth for the same period or even plateau. Any concerns or questions you have about your child's learning should be emailed to your child's classroom teacher.

Thank you again for the ongoing support that you have provided your child and the teachers this semester.
