Attendance

Please remember that students are not to arrive at school earlier than 8:45am without an adult in attendance. Our school yard is unsupervised until this time. If your child needs to be at school earlier than this, please book them in to before school care. All students arriving after 9am must sign in at the office. Any students remaining at school at 3:45pm will be escorted to the office at the front of the school for collection. It is expected that students who are not collected by 3:45pm are registered for out of school hours care, so that they can be placed in care if families cannot collect their children by 3:45pm.

VISITING THE SCHOOL and CHLDREN COLLECTION AT THE END OF THE DAY

A reminder to everyone that we have a policy which requires all visitors to report to the office first when entering the school. Should you need to visit the classroom, see your child at recess or are a helper at school, please report to the office first, to sign the visitor's register and pick up your visitor's tag (yes, we are reintroducing the visitor lanyards). This ensures that in an emergency can account for all people at school.

If you are having someone collecting your children that is not on your emergency contact list or does not normally pick up your child, can you please send a note to your teacher and/or the office. This is especially important for the junior children as we release the children from their class for the day.

OSHC

"GETTING TO KNOW YOUR CHILD" INTERVIEWS

- Provide information to teachers regarding their child's strengths, talents, issues or concerns.

Information shared by parents to teachers will assist us to plan for and work as effectively as possible with you and your child throughout the year. Interviews will be 10 minutes in length. We will send out booking information next Wednesday. It is not compulsory to meet your teacher in person about your child at this stage of the year, but we would certainly like to have met you all; however if a teacher specifically wishes to see certain parents, they will ask for this to occur.
