Both ladies will be planning the curriculum and communicating together, with the 3/4 team, to ensure your child has continuity of learning.

### **NAPLAN**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. Our Year 3 and 5 students will take part in the NAPLAN assessment starting next week. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national proficiency standards. NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

### **NAPLAN Timeline:**

The NAPLAN assessment period is from Wednesday 12th March to Monday 24th March.

At Tecoma PS we aim to complete the NAPLAN testing between Wednesday 12th to Wednesday 19th March. Any students that are absent on these dates will have the opportunity to complete their NAPLAN assessments during the week of March 17th to March 21st.

### About the Mental Health in Primary Schools (MHiPS) initiative and the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader role...


MHiPS is a government funded program, working in conjunction with the Murdoch Children's Research Institute and the University of Melbourne. It aims to:

- Understand the current mental health and wellbeing needs in Victorian Primary Schools
- Design and implement a new school based Mental Health & Wellbeing Leader role
- Evaluate the effectiveness of the MHWL role in helping to address children's mental health issues.

I am excited to develop this role to support our staff, students and families in understanding and focussing on mental health literacy and supports. The jigsaw below outlines the aspects of the role but to break it down a little, my focus is on:

### Where we will begin:

Baseline surveys of students, staff and the community to ascertain our biggest areas of need. We have been able to secure the Resilient Youth Survey and expertise to help us. Further details regarding this will be forthcoming.

- Building staff capacity to identify and support the mental health and wellbeing needs of their students
- Conducting a review of our current wellbeing framework and the overall structure of our school's approach, with a focus on identifying areas for improvement
- Collecting and analysing wellbeing data and finding evidence-based supports to address any focus areas
- Promoting good mental health by ensuring that wellbeing is embedded into the curriculum in all classrooms and areas of the school
- Working with groups of students to gain student voice regarding their mental health and wellbeing.
- Targeting supports for students by working with regional staff, leadership, teachers, parents/carers and community based support services
- Working alongside teachers to create behaviour support or safety plans for students who need extra support.
- Creating a directory of outside supports for families and staff to access

### Common misconceptions about the MHWL role. It does not include:

- · Focusing on the mental health assessment of individual students
- Conducting counselling or other roles that would typically be undertaken by an allied health professional
- Conducting classes or backfill for a teacher or an allied health worker, unless directed in exceptional circumstances
- · Providing administrative or operational services for the school


Feel free to come in for second hand uniform. Cash is preferred for second hand items as this goes towards our chook food and the vegetable garden.
