

# TOWARDS NO RUBBISH AT TPS



From the beginning of Term 2, TPS will be kicking off our goal to become a "NO RUBBISH" school. This goal is part of our broader sustainability initiatives. As you are aware, we already encourage nude food, however we are still finding huge amounts of rubbish in our yard after snack and lunch. We are therefore going to try a new approach to reducing this rubbish by putting in place 2 designated eating areas for those students who don't finish eating in the allocated time in class.

The first area will be in the courtyard between the white admin building and the Prep building and the second will be the area behind the 1/2 building. Both spaces have ample seating and shade and will have a set of bins (recycling and rubbish). Outside of these areas there will no longer be rubbish bins around the school as we expect that weekend and holidays users of our grounds will take their rubbish home with them. We will be reminding students of this new process in the first weeks of Term 2 and our yard duty teams will redirect students to the designated areas to finish eating.

Our container deposit scheme (CDS) bins for families to donate their 10c bottles and cans have been updated and will now be located in the amphitheatre along the hall wall. This will allow for easy access, so please don't forget to bring along your bottles and cans for the school.

We trust that our wonderful Tecoma community will get behind our sustainability initiatives and help make our yard beautiful simply by supporting our rubbish free program.
