### Welcome to Term 4, 2025 from Mrs. Double

Welcome back, for the final term of 2025. I hope you had a great holiday with your children and were able to get away somewhere despite the less favourable weather in Melbourne. I had the most amazing time in Prague, Budapest, Amsterdam (and all the little towns along the river between those two cities) and in Singapore during my leave in Term 3. It seems like a distant memory now, but I do have hundreds of photos and some lovely memories of our time away.

As you are aware, from Brooke's message that was sent out on Monday afternoon, there have been a few changes in the holidays. This is the nature of a school, that when teachers are given opportunities to further their careers, that we allow them to do this. Unfortunately, not all teaching vacancies come out at the end of a school year, and even though we will miss those who are no longer here, we are extremely proud of and excited for Phil, Stuart and Brooke in their new roles. I know you will join me in wishing them all the best.

This week, we called for an internal Expression of Interest for a staff member to take over the Assistant Principal role, whilst I am Acting Principal. I will let you know the outcome, once the process is completed.

I would also like to share with you that Veronica Logan, one of our part time Year 3/4 teachers, has taken over the role of our school tutor. We thank Veronica for taking on this further position, for the rest of the term. It means the wonderful program, which was in place, is able to continue.

Looking at our term overview, there is a lot that we need to get done so please keep an eye out on COMPASS for notifications that come in. The process is so much easier now, so please make it a priority that if your child needs consent to attend an event, fill out the form as soon as you get it online so that we aren't having to chase it up.

### STAFFING AND GRADE STRUCTURES FOR 2026:

I cannot believe we are at this time of year again, but we are now looking at structures for 2026.

Throughout November and early December, we will be working on our class structures and student combinations for next year.

Changes in student numbers and staffing combinations usually cause us to reshape our proposed class structures several times throughout this term.

We have several staff placements that may or may not be a part of our 2026 staff team, with various interview processes to occur, some which have already commenced.

At this stage, we hope to have **17 classes** next year, for what is expected to be **around 348 students**. However, we need definite numbers across all levels before we make that decision.

Due to this, it is vital that we are made aware of any circumstances that may impact on our enrolment numbers. **Please let us know urgently** if you intend to enrol a child at our school, if you are aware of people in our community who will be enrolling or if you intend to move house, therefore transfer to another school. We desperately require this information as soon as possible in order to establish grade structures for the start of the new school year.

If your child will not be at Tecoma in 2026, please notify the school office in writing as soon as possible.

### What are the criteria that we use to make up class lists?

Factors influencing class structure are:

- the educational needs of the students
- the projected number of students in each year level
- the ratio of girls to boys
- the number of teachers employed at the school
- and resources and facilities.

### Factors which are considered in the placement of students include:

- academic performance judgments over time
- work habits, e.g. ability to work independently
- behaviour
- gender balance
- social network/friendships
- social maturity
- special needs, e.g. twins, siblings, etc.

### What is the process for placing students into classes?

Based on the criteria listed above, teaching staff and administration meet mid-term 4 to establish classes for the following school year.

Teachers ensure each new class has:

- a balance of academic ability
- gender balance
- socially balanced groups

During this process, changes and adjustments are made over several weeks. Each change may trigger a chain reaction of other changes.

Proposed class lists are submitted to the myself and my Acting AP for final ratification.

With this in mind, parents are now invited to write to me about any additional information that will help us in determining a placement for your child.

### **2026 GRADE PLACEMENT REQUESTS**

Parents are now invited to write to me about any concerns they may have for their child's educational needs for 2026.

Please note, requests for particular teachers **will not be** considered as the best interests of all of the children and the effective management of the school must be taken into account.

### Letters will be considered up until 4pm, Friday 24th October, 2025.

Letters received after this date will not be accepted. These letters are to be addressed directly to myself with all details and information provided kept in confidence.

If you have submitted a letter in the past to Mr Thompson, you will need to resubmit one this year to Mrs Double please.

As you may understand, the allocating of children to classrooms is a very complex task and one that requires patience and a great deal of thought and manipulation. Please assist us to make this process as smooth as possible by taking note of the requests as outlined.

Please also be aware that requests are indeed requests and it does not mean it will automatically happen. We have decided, on balance, in previous years to not grant some requests. This is done with all the information that we have at our disposal and every decision will be made for the betterment of all children.

Should you wish to discuss any concerns with 2026 grade placements, please contact the school office to arrange a time for a chat.

### **EXTREME & CATASTROPHIC FIRE DANGER DAYS**

Our school is one of many schools across Victoria that is a Bushfire at Risk school. Like all Bushfire at Risk Schools, we are closed on any declared Catastrophic Day.

Information about the current and expected Fire Danger Ratings can be found in weather forecasts on daily news programs, published on websites and in newspapers, broadcast on radio and on the CFA website.

With fire season fast approaching it is a good time to remind our families to ensure that all your details are up to date at the school. We require the most up to date records to ensure we can contact you.

If you have changed address, got a new phone number or have a new alternative contact, please contact the office to give us the details so that we are able to contact you if required.

### IMPORTANT DATES FOR THIS TERM

Even though you will receive the most up to date Parent Term Overview in the next few days, there are a couple of special dates which you will need to put in your diaries:

- Orientation Day, when the year 6 Students go and visit their 2026 Secondary Schools for the day, other Tecoma students spend some time in their 2026 class with their new teacher and also when our Prep students for 2026 spend the morning with us, will be on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> December. At the end of this day your child will bring home their class list for the following year.
- Teacher's Professional Practice Day, which will be a Pupil Free Day on Friday for all staff to plan in their 2026 teams for the upcoming year will be on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> December. This is the day that you will receive your child's Semester 2 reports.
- This is also the day after our **Carol's evening**, which is on **11**<sup>th</sup> **December**.
- For Year 6 parents, there is going to be a **BIG DAY OUT for the 6's** on **Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> December**, and of course, they will have their **Graduation Evening** on **Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> December**.
- One date that our community look forward to is the final assembly of the year due to the fact that
  we farewell our Grade 6 children for their final day of primary school after their 7 year journey and
  where we wish you all a happy holiday. The date and time for this is Thursday December 18th
  from 2.45pm 3.30pm.
- Friday 19<sup>th</sup> December, as in previous years, is a Pupil Free Day.


### **CONGRATULATIONS**
