SCHOOL UNIFORM (INCLUDING HATS)

There has been a significant increase in students attending school without the correct uniform over recent weeks. It is a requirement for all students to be in the correct school uniform, including the school hat. Our uniform shop has a full range of stock on hand you can purchase. Hopefully we can see a return to full uniform next week.

Finally, currently there is a significant amount of misplaced uniform items in the lost property containers, which are located just outside the staff room in the main building. We ask that all uniform items are named so that if we do pick them up, they can be returned quickly, and we encourage families to check the tubs to see if any of their lost items are there.

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

During the months of October to December, areas of Victoria are particularly prone to bouts of combined pollen and weather conditions that can result in 'Thunderstorm Asthma' in children and adults. On days of high risk of Thunderstorm Asthma at school, staff carefully consider conditions, and may have some outdoor activities relocated indoors (such as PE) to limit the potential impact of conditions that could result in a student having Thunderstorm Asthma.
