NEW PRINCIPAL ANNOUNCED FOR TECOMA PS

I am sure you all saw the Compass message last Friday from our school Council President, Lisa Dell, announcing our new Principal, Katrina Ellis, who will be starting at Tecoma PS in 2026.

I was fortunate to meet Katrina last week, at a Principal function, and I know she is extremely excited to be joining us next year.

REPORTS

On Friday, 12th December, student reports will go 'live' on COMPASS. The Prep-2 children will bring home a reflection sheet, whereas this is embedded in the report for grades 3-6.

The Mathematics and English components of the reports will be based on teachers making judgments of student progress using the Victorian Curriculum in Mathematics and English based on a range of assessment approaches. Your child's teacher has reported against the relevant curriculum area achievement standards based on assessments undertaken and evidence collected.

All reports will contain an overview of what the students have been taught in each subject area, which is then followed by a box which shows where each child's knowledge and skills sit, at the time of the reports being written. Each child's effort and behaviour is also shown for each subject area.

We acknowledge that growth in learning looks different for each child. There are times in their schooling when your child may make more than 12 months of learning growth in any one year, whilst at other times they may make 6 months of learning growth for the same period or even plateau. Any concerns or questions you have about your child's learning should be emailed to your child's classroom teacher.

Thank you again for the ongoing support that you have provided your child and the teachers this semester.

Free public transport

From Thursday 1 January 2026, people aged under 18 can travel free on all Victorian public transport services.

This includes trams, trains, buses and coach services.

Previously people aged 5 to 18 years could use a child myki card and buy a concession fare.

To access free travel from January, they must use a new youth myki card and tap the card on and off each time they travel. For areas that do not use myki cards, they must show their myki card to travel free.
